The Madison County 310 Board is a public non-profit organization. Our name originates from Act 310 which provides for the formation of public organizations to contract with the Department of Mental Health. The board members are volunteers who are appointed by the City of Huntsville and Madison County Commission.

These governmental entities also provide limited funding that supports programs for people with intellectual disabilities. Funding is also provided by the Department of Mental Health and the Alabama Medicaid ID and Living at Home Waiver programs.

## Services

The Board works to identify and develop resources to meet the needs of the citizens of Huntsville, Madison City, and Madison County. Our agency is available to assist eligible individuals with intellectual disabilities, and their families, in finding and securing the services that are best for them. These services include, but are not limited to: group homes, day programs, employment services, in-home supports, and medical supplies.

Service Coordination is provided for individuals that are receiving services through the ID and Living at Home Waiver to ensure that services provided are safe and beneficial to the consumer.

If your child has an Intellectual Disability and they are currently in high school, we can provide information regarding transitional services that may be available once the student ages out of high school.
